St Mary's Catholic First School Pupil Premium Report 2015-2016

Pupil Premium was introduced in April 2011. It is allocated to support the attainment of children who are looked after by the local authority, those who have been eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years (also known as Ever 6 FSM) and for children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces.

The level of premium for 2015-16 is £1,320 per primary pupil,

From April 2014 children who are looked after are allocated a higher rate of funding than children from low-income families - the 'Pupil Premium Plus', which for 2015-2016 will be £1,900 per pupil. This is to reflect the unique challenges they face at school where they often struggle to keep up with their peers.

Children who have parents in the armed forces are supported through the service child premium which for 2015-16 is set at £300 per pupil.
