Reception Class Topics - Summer Term 2017

Phonics

Your child will be recapping on sounds learned in their phonic sessions so far and learning to place these into words and short sentences. This is a daily activity after registration.

Reading Activity

Every day your child will continue to be involved in a reading activity - this half term the activities include reading and discussing simple texts in a group with Mrs Bourne, reading/writing words and sentences with Mrs Peach, performing a story using masks, reading/writing on the ipad and playing games to promote the learning of alphabet names.

As reception children are expected to learn the names of the letters of the alphabet, as well as the corresponding sound/s, any reinforcement at home would be warmly appreciated.

Writing

We are running writing workshops this half term on a Friday from 2.30 - 3.15, in the reception classroom, so that Mrs Bourne can explain how we teach writing with young children. It also gives you the opportunity to ask any questions. Your child will return to the classroom at 2.45 (after their afternoon playtime) and you will be able to spend the remaining time looking through your child's writing book and sharing a reading book with your child.

Maths

Most of our maths this half term will be based around our topic. We will integrate time and measure into our sport and have shape as part of our continual provision. Keep sending in all of your wonderful maths you do at home onto Tapestry!

Home Learning

Sharing a book/part of a book with your child, on a daily basis, remains one of the key ways that you can help with your child's education. It helps them to concentrate, listen, be inquisitive creative and access the rest of the curriculum at school.

By the end of the academic year we hope that your child will be able to write at least one sentence independently and read it back to themselves. In order to help your child with this then any reason to write at home is beneficial. They should be encouraged to use their phonics to sound out the simple words they need. Thank you to all parents that post their child's home writing on Tapestry.

Continuing playing with numbers up to 20 will be a great benefit to your child and again thank you to all parents who have posted pictures of their child playing number games at home.
