Barriers to Future Attainment (for pupils eligible for PP including academically more able)

A Gap between PP attainment and Non PP Attainment - Low starting points in school - (need to accelerate the attainment)
B Low self esteem and low social and emotional resilience - 6 children - 50% PP also on SEND Register - further 3 children on Interventions to support learning to reach ARE - 25%
C Pupils to be clear on next steps to meet ARE - to be actioned through, target setting, marking and feedback
D Parental involvement - Parents to be guided to support home learning and ensure children are at school on time. Lateness is a cause of concern for 5 children 42%
