<u>Literacy</u> Over the course of the term we will study a selection of narrative and non-narrative writing. We will be following the pathways to writing approach in our learning, focusing on creating sentences with a variety of grammar and word choices. This term we start off by looking at the story of Coming to England by Jon Floella Benjamin. 		<u>Maths</u> During this term we will look at numbers and place value of numbers up to 1000. We will begin to understand how these numbers can be broken into hundreds, tens and units. We will begin looking at different ways to add and subtract using chunking on a number line. In addition to this they will use reasoning to solve a variety of problems.
<u>Science</u> This half term we are learning about rocks. We will compare and group rocks based on their properties, we will describe how fossils are formed, and know that soils are made from rocks.	<u>What did the Romans do for us?</u>  Year 3 Autumn Term	<u>PE</u> This term we will look at multi-skills which involves developing skills for other sports, such as co-ordination, balance, agility and team work. In tag rugby, we will learn how to pass a rugby ball successfully using all team members to score a try. 
<u>Art + DT</u> <u>Art:</u> We will be learning how to sketch with charcoal and chalk to capture a sense of drama or performance.	<u>Humanities</u> Geography: We will look at Italy’s location, culture and geographical features. We will learn to use an Atlas to find the geographical features. We will also learn about volcanoes and how they are formed.	<u>ICT</u> We will look at programs and how they work. As a result we will design, write and debug programs using a range of programs to understand how different programs work in different ways. We will work with various forms of input and output and understand how these can be used. We will look at using the internet and browser addresses.
<u>PSHE</u> We will focus on our friendships with others. 	<u>Music</u> We will learn to understand and appreciate some different music. We will play clapping games, sing in rounds and get used to playing off-beats. <u>French</u> We will begin to join in with key words/phrases in French, for example hello, how are you? We will then explore what words mean for a range of family members, colours and animals.	<u>Forest School</u> We will be introduced to Forest School in Year 3 and will begin the term by learning to tie a variety of knots and learn about why this might be important. We will then use this skill to make a small scale Roman catapult. We will learn the importance of using fire in Roman times and will learn to light the fire. We will use the fire to cook on.
