I have been delighted to be approached by many families with offers of help this week. As a new head teacher I suspect it would be very easy to fall into the trap of referring to the school as "my" school. Of course, it isn't: it is "our" school. We all want the same thing for the children in our care and a school like ours is most successful when families, the Church and school staff all work together. The offers to help with PTA activities, to paint in school, to assemble flat pack for our book exchange, to link with national and international community projects and to find people who can talk to the children about their careers are a clear sign of how much you all value what we offer the children. If any of you are keen gardeners I would be delighted to hear from you...

Please could I ask that parents and carers continue to read with their children at home? For children to become fluent readers they need a number of skills. In order to read quickly enough to be fluent, the children must have a mental link between what is written down and what sounds make up the words. In academic terms, this is called "orthographical mapping". In school, this relates to learning phonics and decoding words. The more the children practise the more their brains are able to make these links. Once the children can read quickly, they need to be able to read written information so that it sounds like natural, spoken speech. You might see this called "prosody". This could involve using intonation or perhaps making different characters sound different. It doesn't matter how old your child is, practising phonics and reading at home are an excellent way to give them a chance to be successful at school and beyond.

We're incredibly proud of his creativity and hard work earned him the Golden Ticket – a fantastic achievement!






Maiden Castle
