Medication for children at St Mary's

A recent audit of all medication kept in school has been undertaken to ensure what we have is supported by the relevant documentation.

Your child's health is of the utmost importance to us and if we have medication for your child, then it is essential that we have the correct permissions in place to administer the medication and have clear instructions as to when to administer it.

Permissions need to be updated annually, therefore, we will alert you if we need any further information for this current year. May I remind you to keep the office informed of any changes in your child's medical needs and that all medication must be taken to the office rather than given to class teachers so that it can be handled & stored correctly – many thanks.

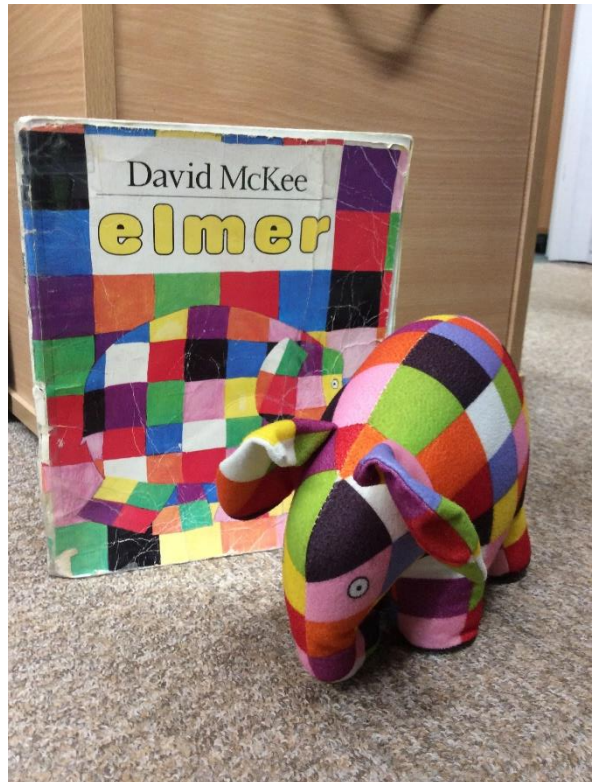
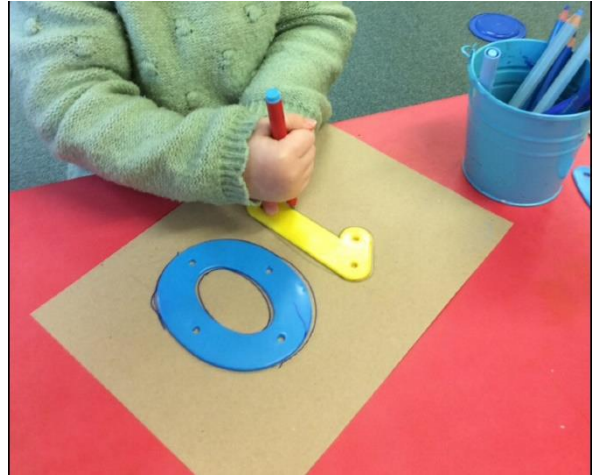
