

Personal, Social, Emotional Development

This half term we will work on forming relationships with other children in the setting. We will play turn taking games so that we develop skills of waiting for our turn and following the rules of a game. Our key workers will support us in finding ways to share resources with others and coming to agreements.

Communication And Language

We will play games which involve listening for a signal, such as 'Simon Says', and use 'ready, steady...go!' Our key workers will support us to predict and order events coherently, by providing props and materials that encourage us to re-enact, using talk and action. Through our Topic work we will extend our vocabulary.

Physical Development

As the weather gets warmer we will recognise when we are thirsty, hot or tired and be able to express our wants and needs to an adult. We will recognise the importance of sun safety and the need to wear sun cream and a sun hat to prevent sun burn.

We will have lots of opportunities to develop our pre-writing skills, ensuring that we have the strength and mobility in our shoulder, elbow and wrist joints to enable us to hold writing tools with control.














Maths

We will be investigating capacity and weight through water play, sand play and using balance scales and kitchen scales. Our key workers will encourage us to make comparisons between weights as we use resources in the setting and will use the mathematical language associated with weight and capacity.

When we are playing games our key workers will encourage us to make mathematical marks and tallies.

We will also be looking at alliterative stories and rhymes and our key workers will encourage us to think of our own alliterative phrases such as 'Sarah's smelly socks'.







Understanding The World


During Spring we will be looking at changes in the natural world, we will develop an understanding of growth and change and we will begin to talk about some of the things we have noticed.

Through discussion of our topic on clothes we will talk about uniforms and who wears uniforms. We will identify people in the community who help us from the uniform they wear.



Please ensure your child is appropriately dressed. We will be outside as much as possible and so your child will need warm, waterproof clothes and shoes every day. As the weather gets warmer please ensure that your child comes to pre-school wearing suncream and that they have a bottle of named suncream to keep in the setting.

Please check your child's spare clothes bag to ensure that their spare clothes are seasonally appropriate.



We will have opportunities to dress and undress baby dolls and wash their clothes and hang them out to dry. We will use fabrics and accessories to create our own dressing up props.

Our key workers will support us in colour mixing activities so that we can explore which primary colours can be mixed together to create secondary colours.
