Introduction

said Mum.

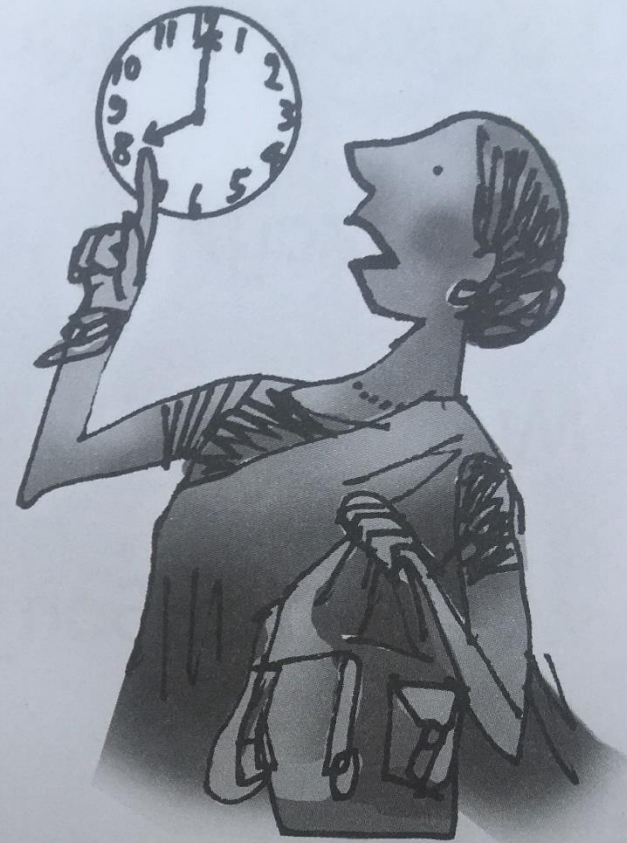


But Sanjay said,

his animals.

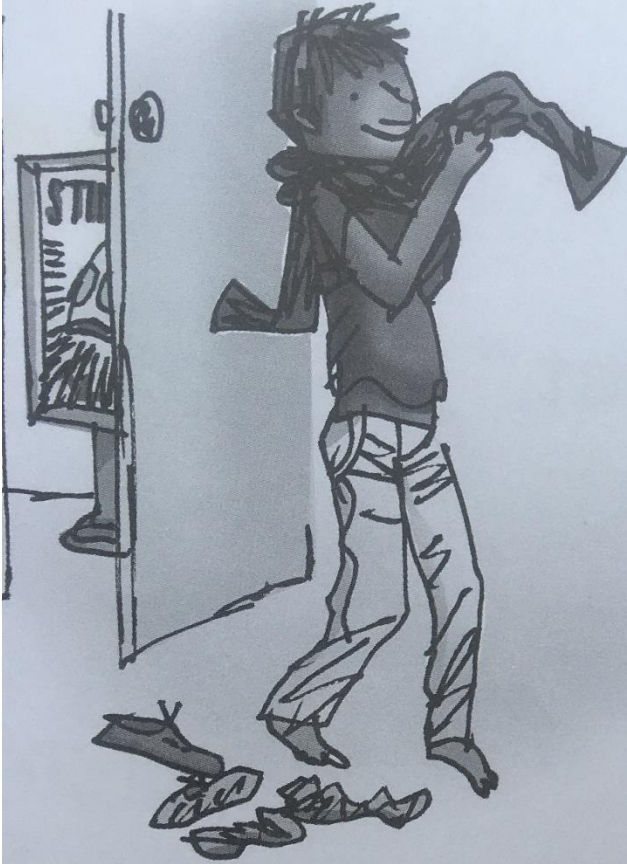


At 1 o'clock, Sanjay had eggs on a tray.
