Pink stars = A prayer of thanksgiving for something we are proud of

**Update to guidance for parents** 

DfE has updated guidance on what parents need to know about early years providers, schools and colleges during COVID-19.

The guidance now includes information on returning to boarding school from overseas, including arrangements for pupils to quarantine on arrival in the UK. It also provides additional information to support parents considering elective home education for their child.

DfE has also published a collection of guidance providing information for parents and carers of children attending early years settings, schools and colleges during the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

This collection brings together information and guidance for parents on:

- essential information for the spring term
  - coronavirus (COVID-19) testing
  - · clubs and out-of-school settings
  - home schooling and remote education
  - support for children and young people
