

Swimming at St Mary's

Children in their classes will have visited the pool this week or early next week so that they know what they will be doing, when swimming starts.

We were hoping to start class & after school swimming from next Monday but an important water check has been delayed. This has to be carried out by an external company on behalf of Public Health England & checked in an external lab before we can allow the children into the water. This test is now being rescheduled to be carried out on Monday and will take a few days to come back. We therefore, hope that we can start swimming on Thursday next week (perhaps Wednesday if the test is quick). We will text parents to confirm which day the children will start as soon as we know.

Y3 & 4 will alternate when they swim/do PE so please continue to come in, in their

PE kits on Tuesdays & Thursdays & bring their swim kit in every day, then we can be flexible.

Where possible, children as asked not to wear jewellery/earrings in the pool.

Swim Vouchers

Vouchers for after school swimming & summer lifeguard swimming will be available to buy or collect from the school office from Tuesday next week.

After school vouchers so that Reception children can swim on Tuesdays & Thursday 2.15-3.00pm & Year 1-4 can swim 3.15-4.30pm (Mon-Fri) cost £10.

If you are a qualified St Mary's lifeguard & wish your children to swim after school & during the summer holidays, the youchers are £20.

Suncream & Water

As we are now in the summer and the weather is warm and sunny, please can children have suncream applied every day before school. Also, please remember water bottles – thank you.
