Each of us, by the way we live our lives, the way we treat others, and by our words and actions, show if we have an attitude of service.

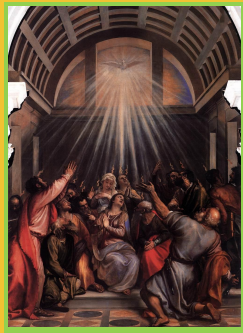
Christians believe that the Spirit of God is active in each person and, in a special way, in the community of believers, which is the Church.

(CCC Prologue 3)

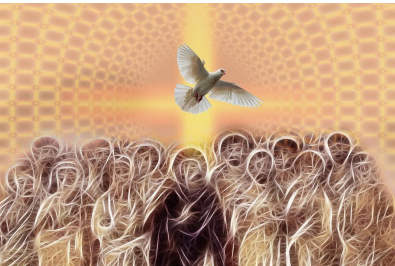
Key skills:

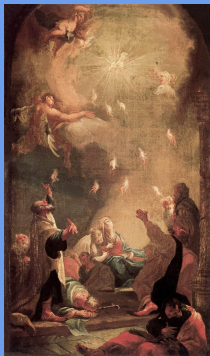
