<p>Instrument Practice</p> <p>If you learn an instrument or have an instrument at home, use this time to put in some great practice.</p> <p>Recorders – Keep on working through your recorder books.</p> 	<p>Be the Teacher</p> <p>Teach your family a new song. Mrs W suggests: 'Penguin song' or 'Hot Cross Buns'.</p> 	<p>Musical Alphabet</p> <p>Can you find a word about music/instruments/bands for every letter of the alphabet?</p> <p>A B C</p>	<p>Feel the Beat</p> <p>Play a song at home. Dance around the room in time to pulse. Can you beat the pulse using: claps, knee taps, stamping, clicks, something else?</p>

Different containers filled with different-sized stones can make all sorts of sounds.</p> 	<p>World Music</p> <p>Listen to a piece of music from another country. Can you find that country on a map?</p> 
<p>Writing Lyrics</p> <p>Write a chant about the things you like. This could be school, favourite sports, playing games, books... the list is endless!</p> 	<p>Singing Club</p> <p>Join in and sing a different song everyday with soprano singer Elin Manahan Thomas.
