We will learn that God loves and cares for every family.  We will learn to work together, to celebrate together and to know St Mary's Gospel Values.  We will recognise acts of kindness by adding hearts to the branches of our Kindness Tree.</p>	<p><b><u>Characteristics Of Effective Learning</u></b>  At St Mary's we want our children to be the best they can be, we encourage a love of learning through our Characteristics:  Go for it Gorilla: I will have a go  Editing Elephant: I can edit and improve my work  Creative Chameleon: I have my own ideas  Concentrating Crocodile: I join in and concentrate  Persevering Parrot: I keep trying  Proud Peacock: I am proud of what I do</p>
<p><b><u>Literacy</u></b> In phonics sessions we will be consolidating phonics learning in reception and applying set 2 and 3 sounds in our writing. We will be having cursive handwriting sessions to learn to join letters by starting and finishing in the right place and spelling lessons linking the focus words we are using in our topic writing .  <b><u>Little Red Riding Hood Integrity, Courage, Forgiveness &amp; Justice</u></b>  We will be reading 'Little Red Riding Hood' We will explore the themes in familiar fairy stories and traditional tales, retelling them and considering their particular characteristics. Following 'The Write Stuff' our lessons will include experience lessons to inspire, sentence stacking lessons to model writing and independent writing lessons to further develop our creative writing skills. We will learn how to segment spoken words into individual phonemes and then write them into sentences and explore a range of writing genres in this interactive storybook to stimulate imaginative and creative writing.</p>		<p><b><u>Maths</u></b>  We will be following the Power Maths scheme to learn to count, order and reason about numbers using concrete apparatus and pictorial representations and abstract form.  We will become secure in our learning of numbers to 10. We will learn to write numbers in numerals and words to 10, to add and subtract numbers to 10 becoming familiar with number patterns, more and less and ordinal numbers. We will be using a part/whole model to explore related facts and number bonds within 10.</p>
<p><b><u>Science - Humility, integrity</u></b>  In Science we will be learning to name and label the parts of the human body. We will learn about the 5 senses and how we use them in our daily lives. We will be investigating how we use our senses through a variety of science experiments.</p>	<p><b>Once Upon a Time</b>  <b>Can you retell a traditional tale?</b></p> <p>Year 1  Autumn Term 1</p>	
<p><b><u>Art + DT - Humility, Compassion, Kindness, Justice</u></b>  In Art we will be learning about an artist called Molly Haslund <a href="https://www.mollyhaslund.com/circles-2013-2">https://www.mollyhaslund.com/circles-2013-2</a> and practising how we draw really carefully - making big circles and small ones using different mediums to draw with.</p>	<p><b><u>Geography</u></b>  In Geography we will be learning about change - in our seasons, school and town. We will be labelling features on a map and how they have changed over time. We will be learning how to identify features on a map and to draw our own map with a simple key. We will also be introducing the compass points - north, south, east and west.</p>	<p><b><u>PE - Integrity, Courage, Kindness</u></b>  The children will learn Multi-skills: Concentrating on ABC's (Agility, balance and coordination), spatial awareness, 'sending' in different ways (rolling, bouncing and throwing) and Travelling in different ways.  <b><u>Music</u></b>  We will be listening to Prokofiev's 'Peter and the Wolf', learning to identify the characters from the instruments we hear and then learn to compose a themed piece using tuned and untuned instruments to represent the characters and mood in a familiar traditional tale. We will be using DASP music and Charanga resources to learn songs and rhythms together.</p>
<p><b><u>PSHE - Compassion, Forgiveness, Peace &amp; Integrity</u></b>  In PSHE we will be learning about friendship and kindness. We will be talking about how we can solve problems and take care of ourselves to stay healthy. We will be creating rules for a happy classroom and thinking about how we can be the best we can be this year. We will explore how our families are special to us.</p>	<p><b><u>History</u></b>  We will be learning that history is learning about the past. We will learn about the history in our living memory and create a class timeline to record events throughout our year. Linking to studying a map of our town, we will be learning about the history of Dorchester - ordering historical places in chronological order.</p>	<p><b><u>Forest School - Humility, Justice, Kindness</u></b>  In Forest School lessons we will be planting bedding plants in pots in the outside area of our classroom. During this half term we will be linking our outdoor learning to the science curriculum by exploring our grounds for wildlife and learning about the similarities and differences in the wildlife we see in our grounds. We will also be using this time to work cooperatively in groups and to share stories linking to our topic learning.</p>
