You will learn to name, draw and label the parts of the body. You will know which sense is linked with different body parts.


Key Activities:


I will name the five senses.

Key words: smell, taste, touch, hearing, sight.






Year 1 – ICT – Spring 1 – Maze Explorers

Timeline:

1837 - Queen Victoria became queen →1852 first schools began to be built for the poorer children as well→1872 children were expected to go to school from 5 yrs to 13 yrs →1890 nobody needed to pay to send their children to school anymore →1944 free secondary school places for all →2021 children have to be educated between 5 yrs and 16yrs by law.

Key facts:

- Life was not the same for all children during the Victorian times.
- . Many children did not have lots of toys.
- The Victorians were the people who lived during the reign of Queen Victoria.
- Some children had to work rather than go to school. They worked long hours and it could be dangerous for them.


