RE

During RE for this term we will studying Family and the Domestic Church; In this topic we explore how God is present in every home. This is expressed in the love that binds the family together within the home through good times and bad times.

If you have love for one another, then everyone will know that you are my disciples.' Catechism of the Catholic Church 1657: The home is the first school of Christian life and 'a school for human enrichment.' Here one learns endurance and the joy of work, fraternal love, generous – even repeated – forgiveness and above all, divine worship in prayer and the offering of one's life'.

<u>Literacy</u>

Over the course of the term we will study a selection of narrative and non-narrative writing. We will be following the Write Stuff approach in our learning, focusing on creating sentences with a variety of grammar and word choices. This term we start off by looking at the alternate story of the Three Little Pigs by Jon Sciezka

<u>Maths</u>

During this term we will look at numbers and place value of numbers up to 1000. We will begin to understand how these numbers can be broken into hundreds, tens and units. We will begin looking at different ways to add and subtract using chunking on a number line. In addition to this they will use reasoning to solve a variety of problems.

Science

This half term we are learning about rocks. We will compare and group rocks based on their properties, we will describe how fossils are formed, and know that soils are made from rocks.

Autumn Term

PE

This term we will look at the key skills in involved in netball and rugby. We will learn to develop a range of passing and shooting skills in netball. In tag rugby, we will learn how to pass a rugby ball successfully using all team members to score a try.



Art + DT

Art: We will understand what Chiaroscuro is and how we can use it in our work. We will use light and dark tonal values in our work, to create a sense of drama. We will take photographs of our work, thinking about focus, lighting, and composition.

Humanities

Geography: This term we are looking at Italy and the continent of Europe. Linking in with our History topic on the Romans, we will be looking at The River Tiber and Mount Vesuvius and exploring how rivers and volcanoes work. We will learn about human geographical features in Italy, leading to wider geographical features of continental Europe.

<u>ICT</u>

We will look at programs and how they work. As a result we will design, write and debug programs using a range of programs to understand how different programs work in different ways. We will work with various forms of input and output and understand how these can be used. We will look at using the internet and browser addresses.

PSHE

We will focus on our friendships with others.

Music

We will learn to understand and appreciate some different music. We will play clapping games, sing in rounds and get used to playing off-beats.

Forest School

We will be introduced to Forest School in Year 3 and will begin the term by learning to tie a variety of knots and learn about why this might be important. We will then use this skill to make a small scale Roman catapult. We will learn the importance of using fire in Roman times and will learn to light the fire. We will use the fire to cook on.





French We will begin to join in with key words/phrases in French, for example hello, how are you? We will then explore what words mean for a range of family members, colours and animals.
